

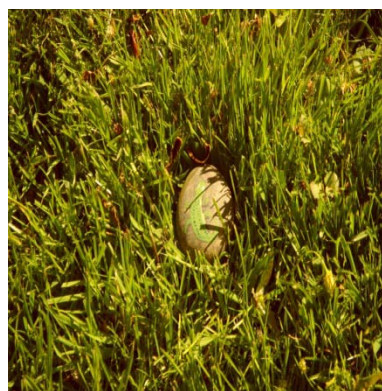
Directions for playing the GPS Egg Hunt

1. Pick up a flag at the registration desk before heading outside.
2. Using your GPS unit, compass, diving rod, or simple geographic intuition, navigate to one or more of the given coordinates (see below). Or, find the coordinates [online here](#)
3. At each location, replace the painted rock with your flag (so others know it is found)
4. Return your rock to the registration desk, log your name and mark off location found to receive your prize.
